Luke 8:41-56, Rom. 10:17 "Jairus Listens to Jesus." All good things come from God. Is being sick good? How many of you like how it feels when you're sick? Sickness and hurt don't come from God at all. They come from the devil. God only gives us good things – like healing. When Jesus died on the cross for us, He took away all of our sin and hurt and sickness. We need to thank Jesus for healing us, even when we don't feel all better yet. Jairus believed Jesus would heal his little girl even before she was better and the woman who touched Jesus' clothes also believed she would be healed before she was better.

Luke 8:41-56, 1 Tim. 2:1-8 "Jesus Helps Others" We may split into a few small groups for prayer time depending on how the class is. Ask each child in your group if there is anything that you can pray for. Make sure you name them specifically when you pray. If there are any older kids in your group you could also ask them if they'd like to pray for someone themselves. Jesus wants us to be happy and healthy. Just like Jesus healed Jairus' daughter and the woman that touched His clothes, He has already made the way for us to be healed and everyone who believes in Him and trusts Him. We need to pray for our friends so that they will know Jesus and be healed. We're never too small to pray. Our prayers are very important!

<u>Kristin</u>	<b>Main Lesson</b> (Using Points From the Outline) Luke 8:41-56, Mark 11:22-26 "Jairus Chooses to Believe" Even though Jairus needed Jesus to come in a hurry to help his sick daughter, he didn't get upset when Jesus took time to stop and help another woman and heal her. Jairus still didn't get mad when he heard the bad news that his daughter had died. Jairus believed and trusted God instead of being mad. When someone makes us upset, we need to pray for them and forgive them before we ask God for anything. If we don't forgive others, God can't forgive us.
<u>Wesley</u>	<b>Memory Verse</b> Ps. 56:11 "I Trust God." Talk about trust for a second. What is trust? When we believe and know that God will take care of us. We trust people that we love. Give a couple of examples of trusting God – believing/trusting Him to heal us, trusting Him to keep us safe, trusting Him to provide food/clothes/shelter for us. You could sing the verse to the tune of "Farmer In The Dell". I trust God (x2), Every day in Every way, I trust God. You could also put actions to it – I trust (use both thumbs to point to yourself), God (point up with one arm). We are strong when we trust God. You could do the song lots of times – fast, slow, quiet, loud, etc. etc.

You could write on the bottom of the paper "Being mad will stop your prayers." We could glue on googly eye to the face and maybe some yarn for hair.

<u>Wesley</u>	<b>Main Lesson</b> (Using Points From the Outline) Luke 8:41-56, Matt. 28:18-20, Mark 16:15-20 "Jesus Helps People" Jesus was always helping people. People followed Him wherever He went. They wanted to listen to Him, learn from Him, and be healed. We need to tell others that the only way we can go to heaven is to ask Jesus into your heart. Some people called Missionaries even go to other countries to tell others about Jesus – you can bring a map or a globe to illustrate (Kristin has a globe if you need/want one, just let me know). You could also print out some pictures of different cultures around the world where missionaries might travel to (the kids love lots of visuals). We don't have to go far away though to share Jesus with others.
